



The General Education requirements for the University specify attainment of an elementary level of mastery of a foreign language, as demonstrated by successfully passing an appropriate course (currently French and Spanish are taught) at Anderson University. The following chart summarizes FL placement.

<b>Foreign Language Placement Guide</b>		
If the student brings from high school:	Student will be placed in:	Completion of requirement:
No foreign language	A 101-102 sequence	Successful completion of 101-102
One credit in foreign language	101 of the <b>same</b> language	Successful completion of 101-102
Two credits or more in the same foreign language	131 of the <b>same</b> language	Successful completion of 131 or 201
One or more credits in a foreign language not taught at A.U.	Option: 101 of a foreign language at A.U. <b>or</b> 101-102 of the other language at another college	Successful completion of 101-102
Foreign students (from non-English-speaking countries)	A 101-102 sequence (not the student's native language) <b>or</b> 2 courses at the 300/400 level of the native language	Successful completion of 101-102 or of the upper-level courses
Transfer students with less than 101-102 <b>college</b> credit for foreign language	Next appropriate course of that language, or (if that language is not offered at AU) 101 of another language	Successful completion of 102-level language

**Notes:**

- 1) A student with one or more high school language credits may take the Foreign Language Placement Test during orientation with the option of being placed at a **higher** level. Upon completion of the higher level course with a grade of C or better, the student will receive credit for the course bypassed. Any exceptions must be approved in writing by the Foreign Language Department.
- 2) Students majoring in Christian Ministries or minoring in Christian Ministries or Religion may satisfy the Foreign Language requirement by passing REL312 (Hebrew) and REL322 (Greek).
